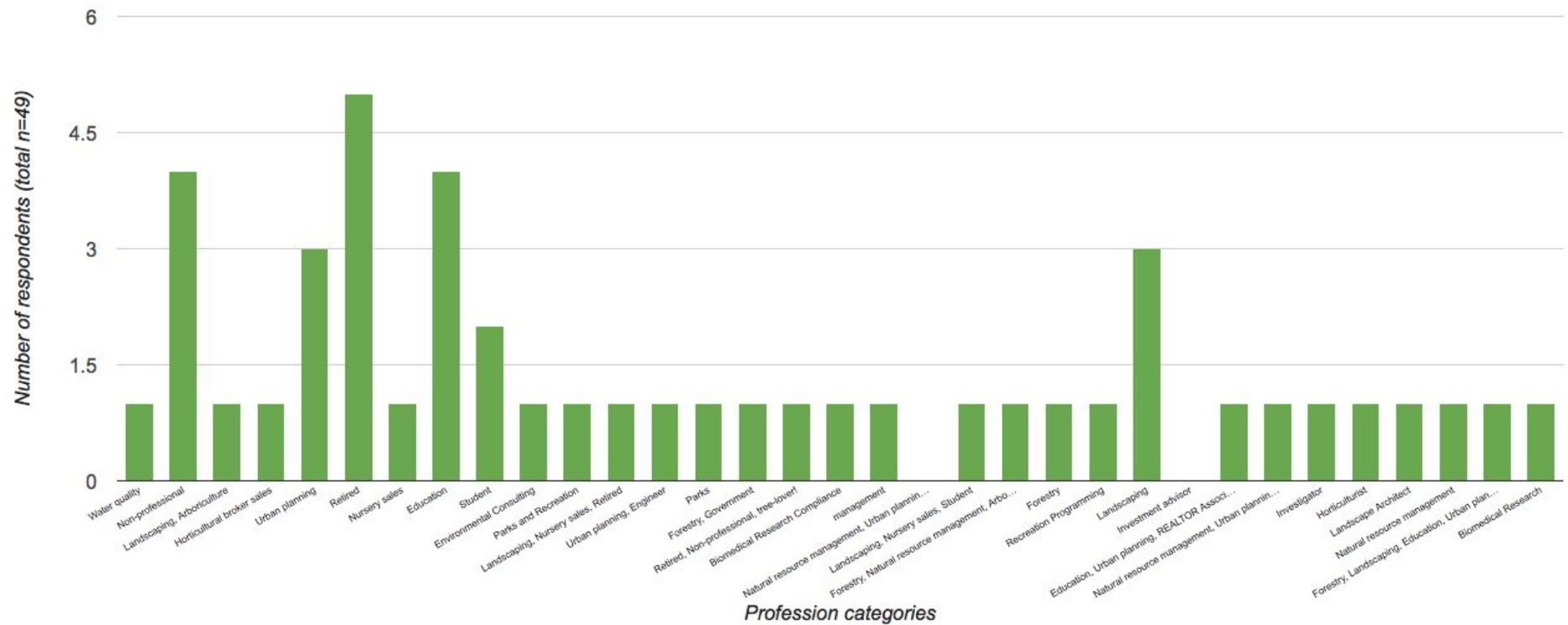


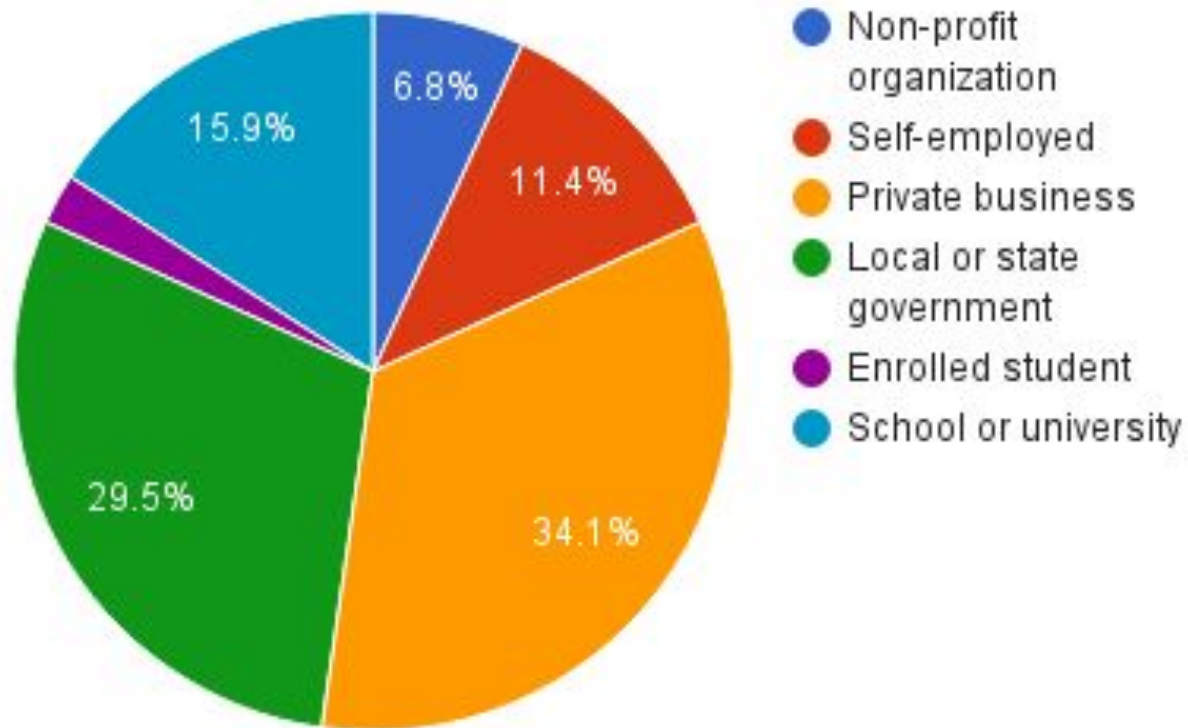
# 2016 NKUCFC Program Survey Results

## 1.1 What is your professional field (check all that apply)?



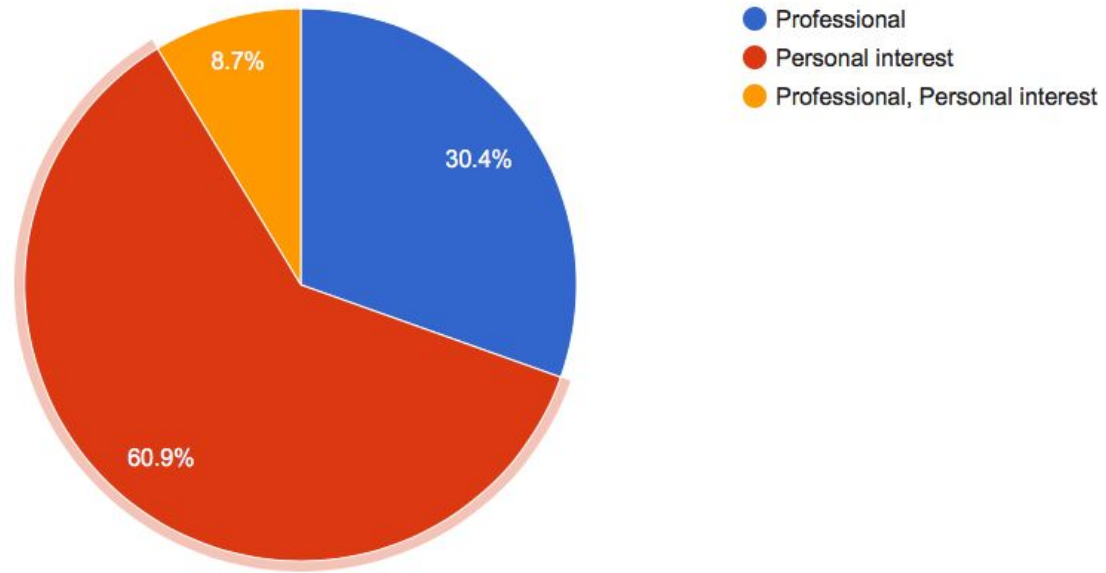

## 1.2 Who is your employer? (total n=44)

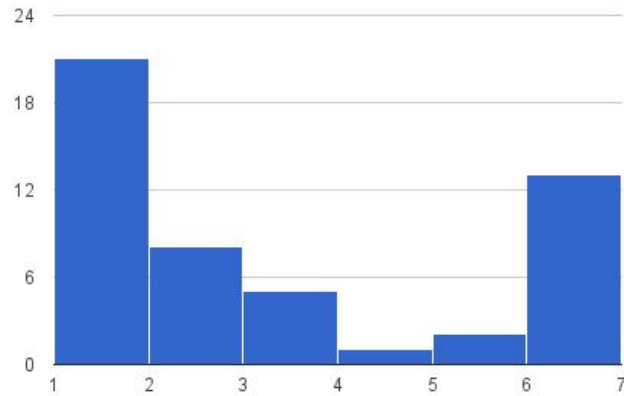


The percent for the enrolled student slice is 2.3%

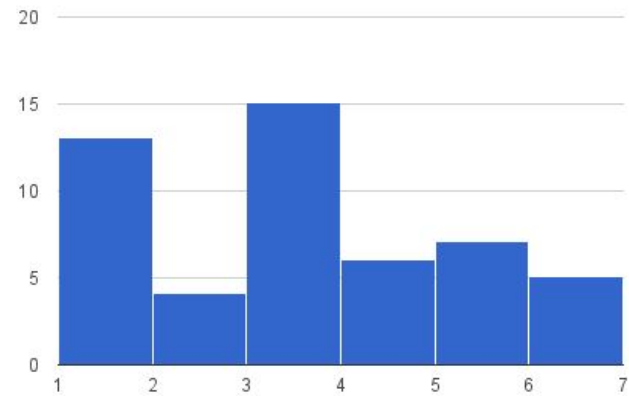


**2.1 Please rank the Council programs in order of importance [Reforest Northern Kentucky]**



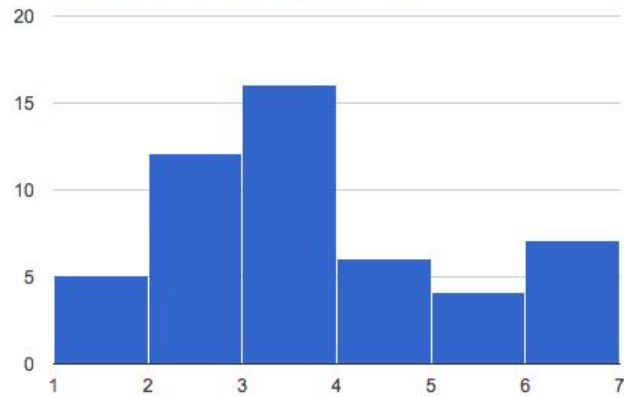

**2.1 Please rank the Council programs in order of importance [Public Workers Tree Seminar]**



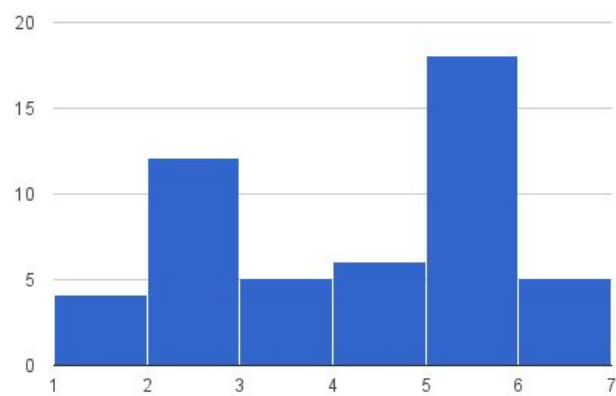

**2.1 Please rank the Council programs in order of importance [Member meetings]**



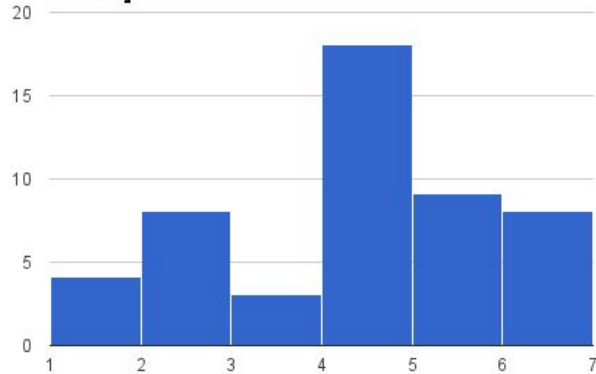

**2.1 Please rank the Council programs in order of importance [Taking Root - Northern Kentucky]**



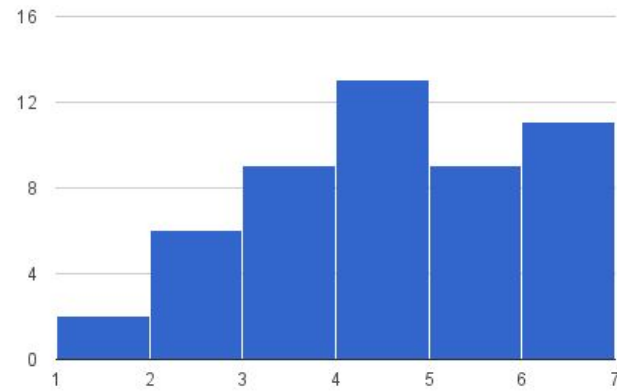

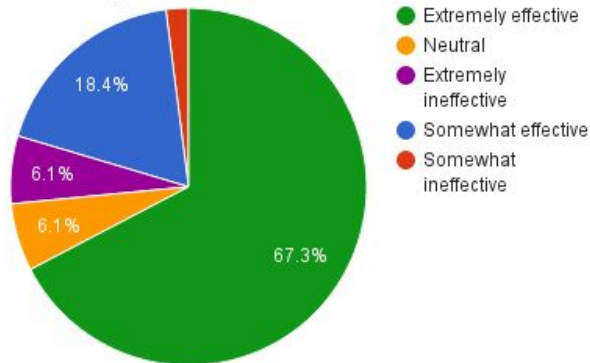

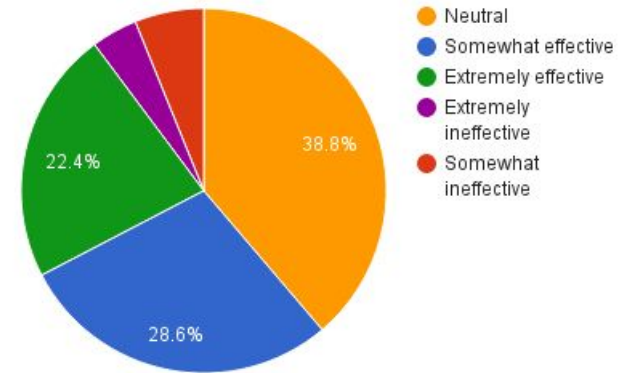

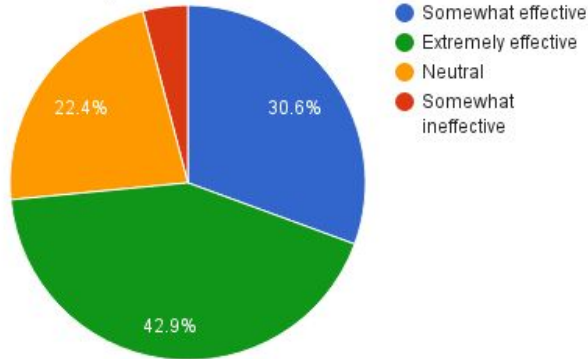

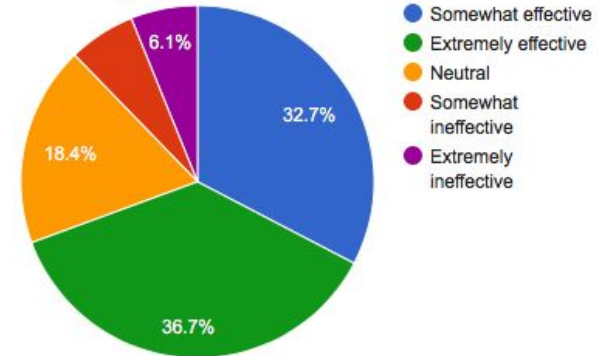

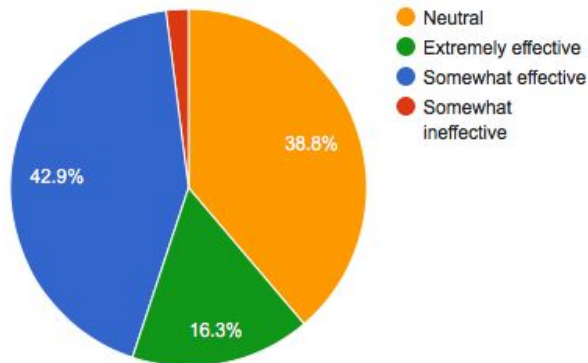

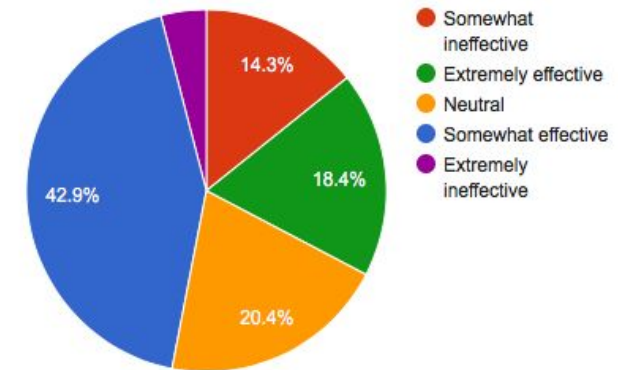

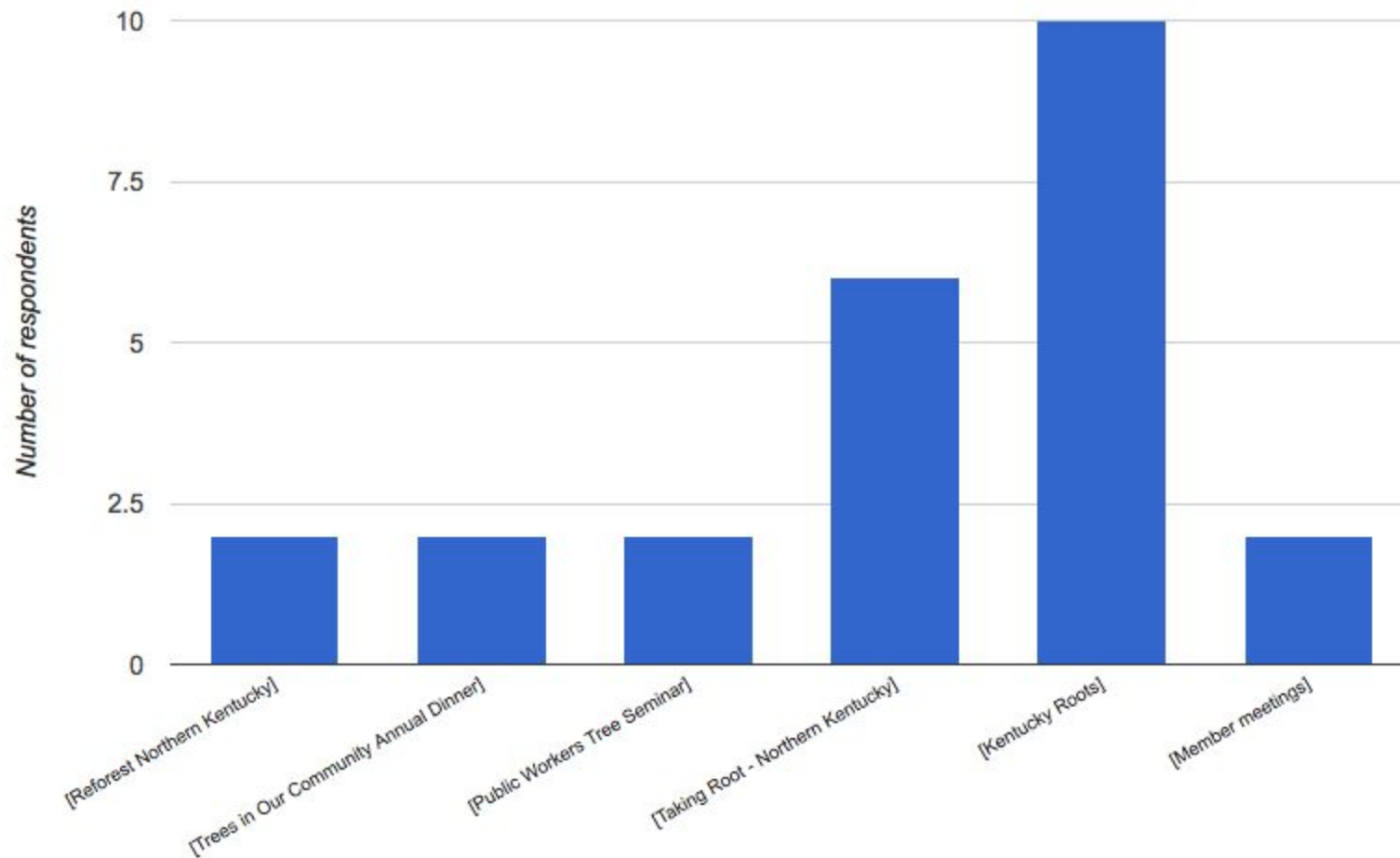

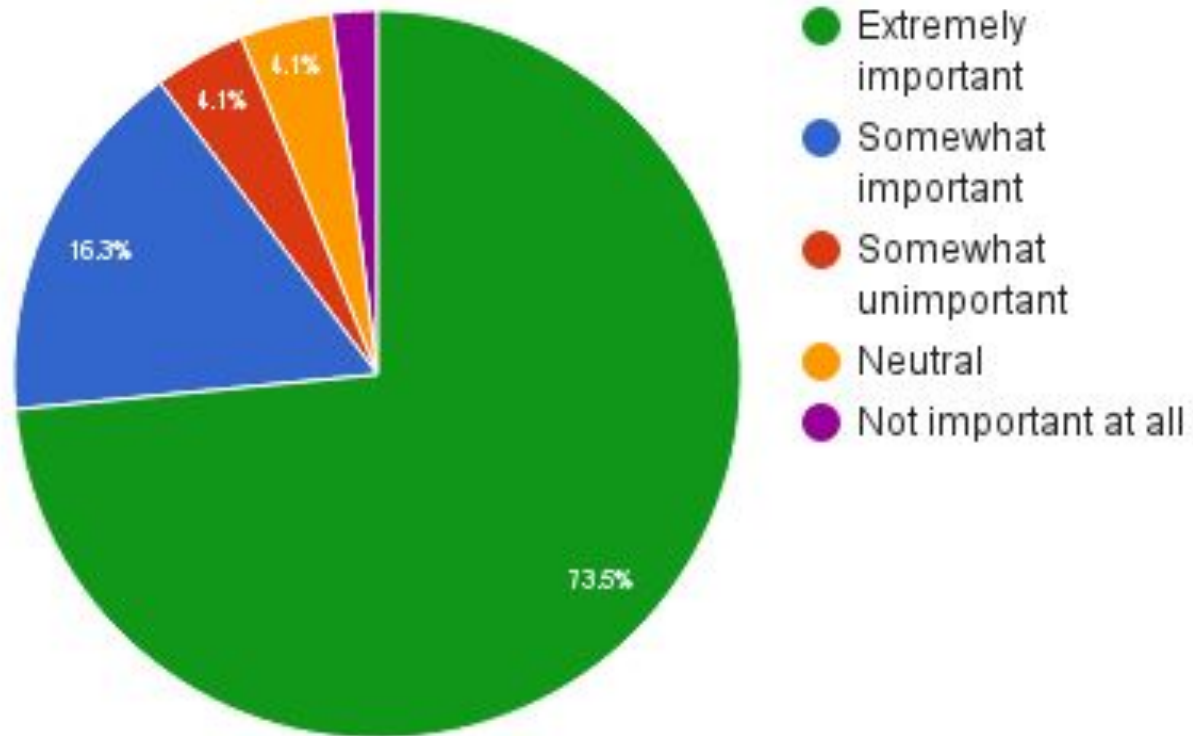


### 2.3 Are there any Council programs that you think are unnecessary or redundant?



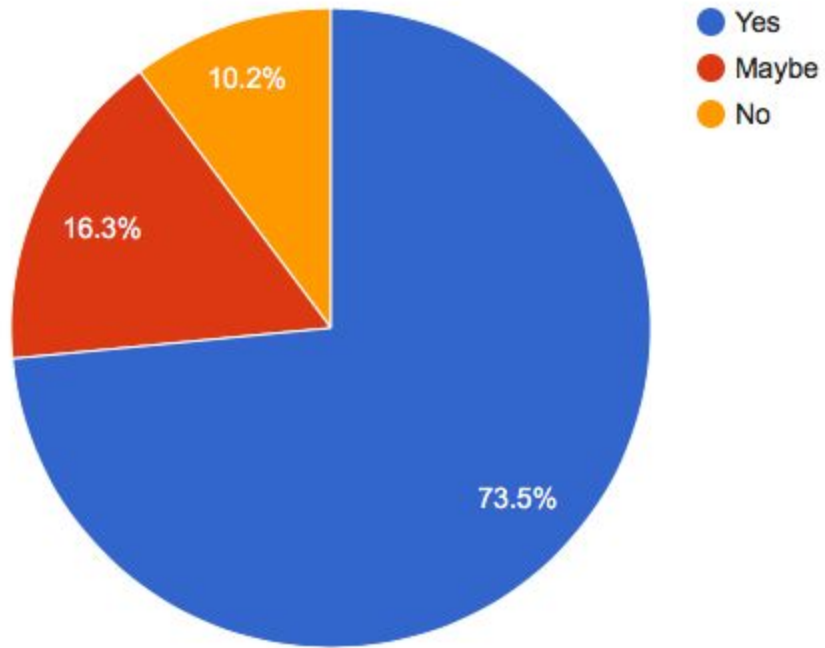

## 2.4 How important do you think it is for the Council to provide youth education? (total n=49)

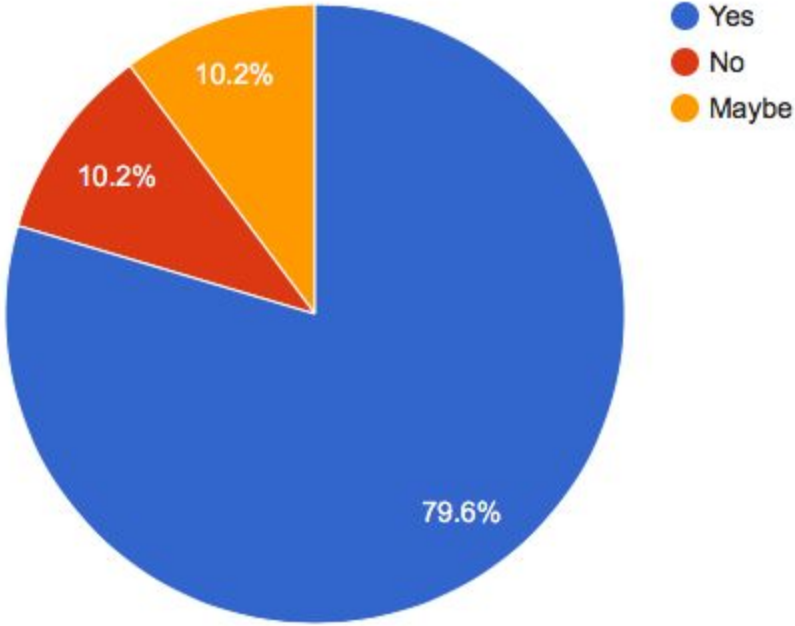

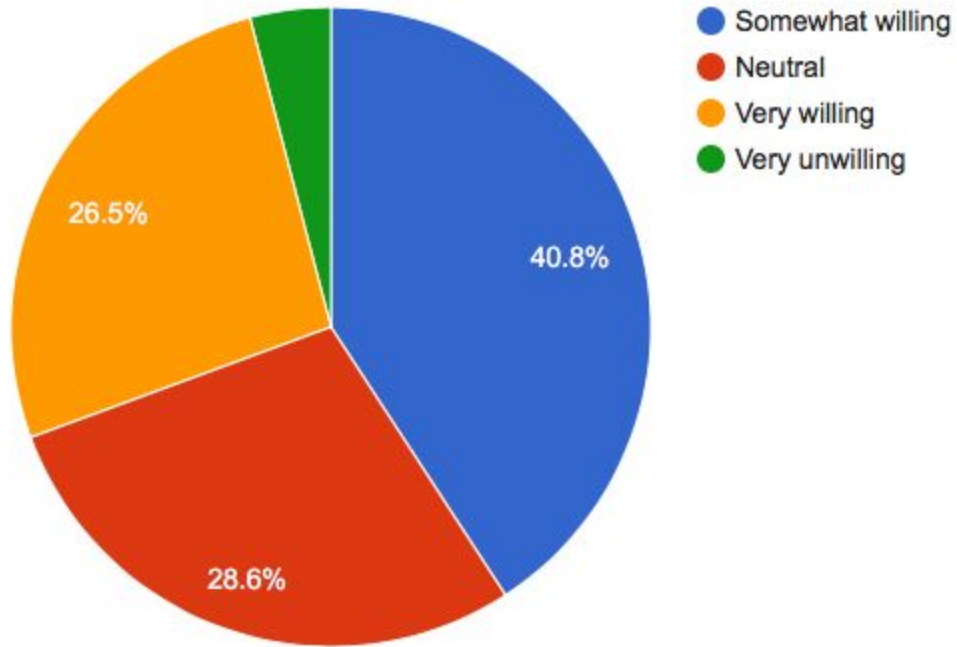

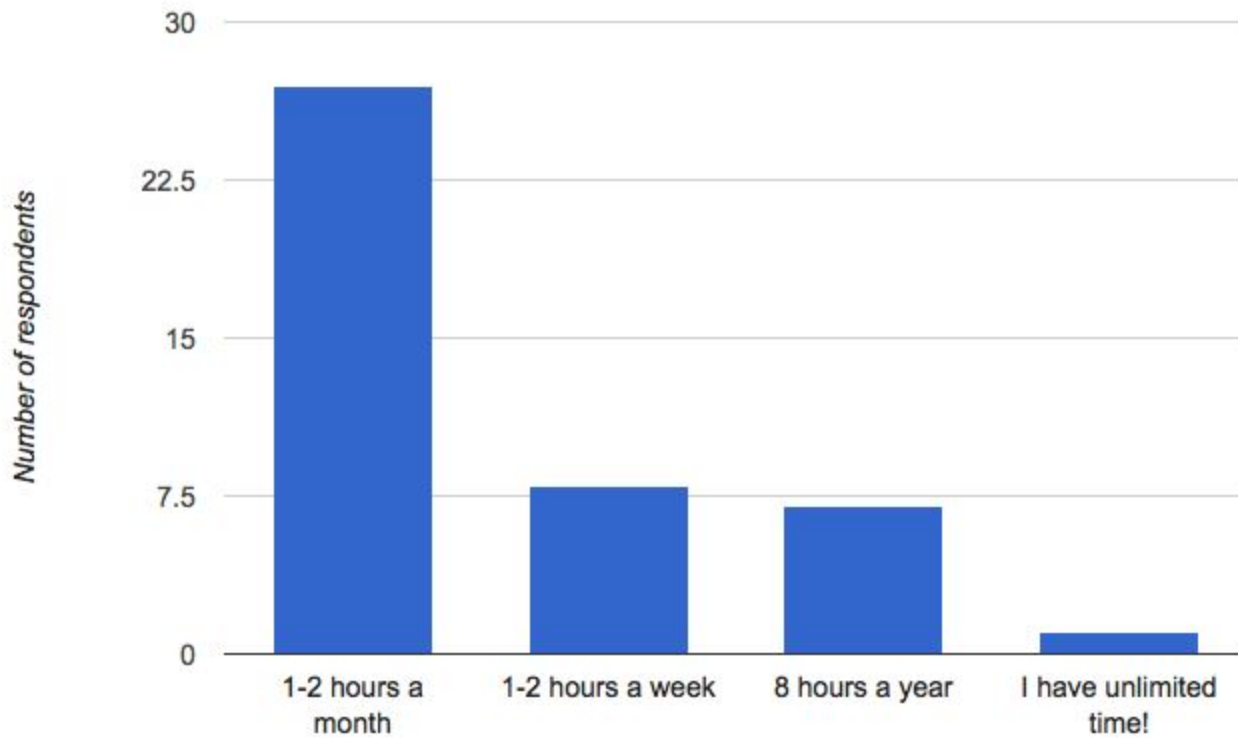
**3.4 Would you be interested in educational opportunities for urban and community forestry assessments/planning?**



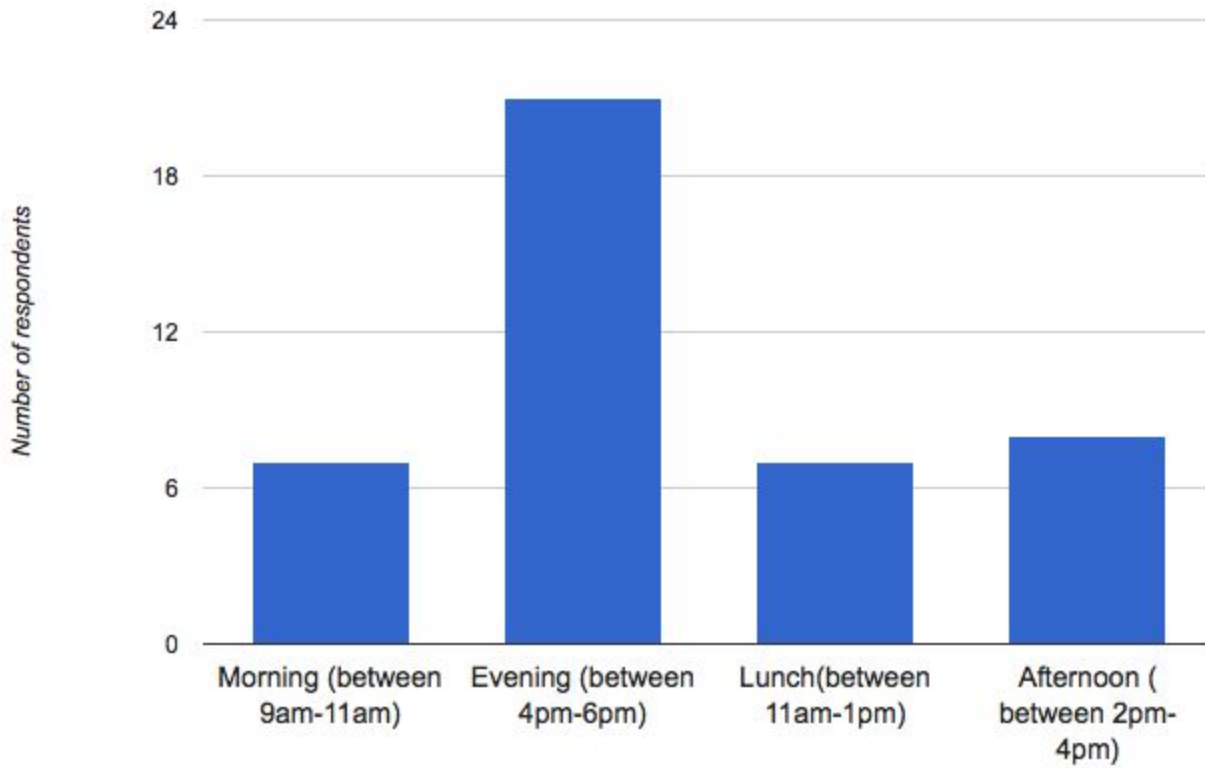
**3.5 How willing are you to help develop new Council efforts? (total n=49)**
